Sacrament of Marriage

CATECHISM CORNER

Advent is a season of waiting, expecting, and hoping. "Advent" is a Latin word and means "coming." For hundreds of years, Christians have used an Advent wreath to remember and celebrate the first coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Advent should also inspire hope as we wait for the Second Coming of Christ. We are calling the Fourth Candle the "Candle of Peace" and it reminds us that Jesus comes to bring Peace to the world and to people's hearts. Without Christ, there is no peace in this world. Isaiah prophetically foretold, "For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given. And the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:61) John recorded the words of Christ: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." (John 14:27¹) The world can be full of turmoil, peace is often a far away dream. When we trust in the promises of Christ, we know that peace will always be in our hearts.

We light this Candle of Peace today knowing that no matter what conditions we find ourselves in, we are never far from the Peace of Christ if we are His. Salvation in Christ is the steady anchor for a life that seems to be full of struggle.
